The Audiology Room




This is the Audiology Room.

The Magic Headphones



The audiologist might have to put a magic headband behind your ear so you can hear the noise —"beep beep".



This is a videoscope. It is like an ear torch.

If you sit really still, the audiologist can look in your ear. This is ok.

You will be able to see your ear on the TV in the clinic room!



The Tympanometry machine.




The audiologist may put the Tympanometry in your ear to check if your ears are working.

How Can I Keep My Ears Healthy?



Don't stick things like cotton swabs and fingernails into them.

Protect your hearing. Turn down the volume on video games, TV and, especially, portable music players.

Wear hearing protection (like earplugs or protective earmuffs/headphones) if you'll be around loud noises (at a concert, car race, etc.).
